ICFRE accredited by UNFCCC as Certification body for Clean Development Mechanism

The Executive Board of the Clean Development Mechanism (CDM) of the United

Nations Framework Convention on climate Change (UNFCCC) in its 59<sup>th</sup> meeting held from

14-18 February 2011 accredited Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE) as

Designated Operational Entity (DOE) for validation, verification and certification of

Afforestation and Reforestation CDM Projects. ICFRE has become the first Designated

Operational Entity (DOE) from India to be accredited by UNFCCC.

The Clean Development Mechanism is a program under the UNFCCC, which allows

emission-reduction projects in developing countries to earn carbon credits in the form of certified

emission reduction (CER) units, one CER is equivalent to one tonne of CO<sub>2</sub>. These CER credits

can be traded sold, and used by industrialized countries to meet a part of their emission reduction

targets under the Kyoto Protocol. Globally so far only 17 entities, including ICFRE, have been

accredited by UNFCCC for the sectoral scope 'Afforestation and Reforestation'

With ICFRE's accreditation as DOE now it can undertake functions of validation,

verification and certification of CDM projects for climate change mitigation under the sectoral

scope of 'Afforestation and Reforestation' (A/R).
