- The present project submitted by the universities can at best be taken as an expression of
 interest of the universities to participate in networking project, based upon which inprinciple approval is being granted for each project subject to a maximum outlay of Rs.
 15 lakhs. With the in principle approval the project stands initiated from 1st November,
 2012.
- 2. All the participating universities will be doing Desk review based on the existing secondary data from various sources to make an assessment of all the NTFPs of the state their production, export and review of problems associated with that. In a period of three months from the initiation of project, the participating university will make a status report, covering all the NTFP's of the state.
- 3. The ToR's for the first year shall inter alia include
 - The work during the first year will involve collating available information from published sources, secondary data from a number of agencies and also collecting primary data from the field. First year will encompass overall survey of NTFPs and will form the baseline for any further examination. The output will give an overall picture of the NTFPs their associated problems and the contribution to livelihood and to the economy.
 - Survey to be conducted in the area assigned to the respective university/institute to assess current status and coverage of NTFPs in the form of area coverage, geographical distribution, the production and the productivity and assessment of the Utilization pattern of NTFP s.
 - Assessment of the problems associated with the NTFPs including the regeneration status, production, marketing and over exploitation *etc.* in the area surveyed.
 - Role NTFP is playing in the livelihood, including utilization and contribution to the household income at micro level and to the economy at macro-level.
- 4. The detailed project report will be developed by them from one month of initiation giving detailed methodology, month-wise work plan and activity schedule, objectively verifiable indicators for project monitoring and project-outputs etc. While developing DPR, the Co-PI from ICFRE institutes will also play a key role in providing technical support.

- 5. Secondary data must be collected for atleast 5 years period wherever time series are used.
- 6. A detailed format will be developed for preparing status report and will be sent to the universities as part of the DPR.
- 7. The following payment schedule linking to the output level has been approved for the project.

- 10. The expenditure will be debited under the Head -Plan (GC) Grant-in-Aid Item No. -14 (Small Grants for Applied research)
